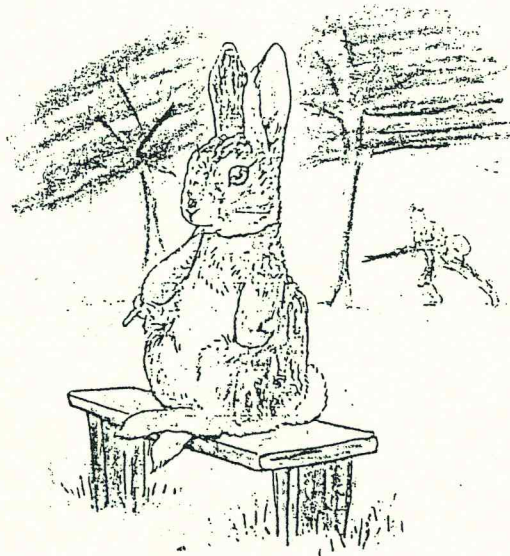

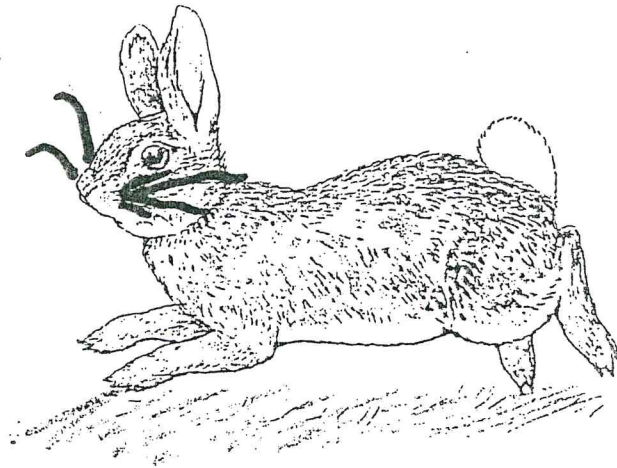

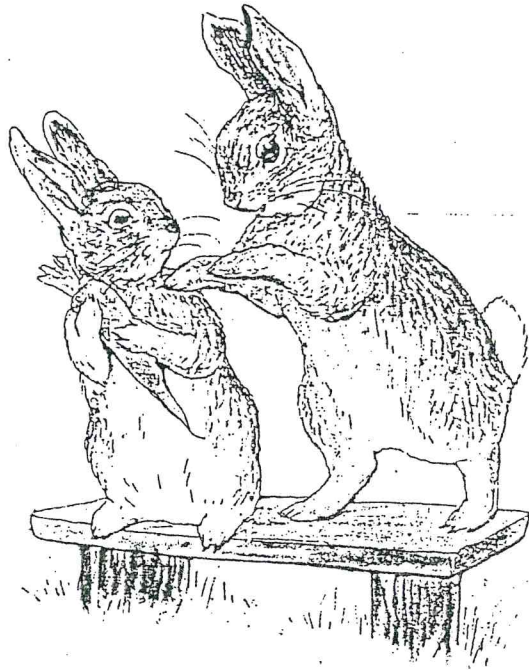

tail.



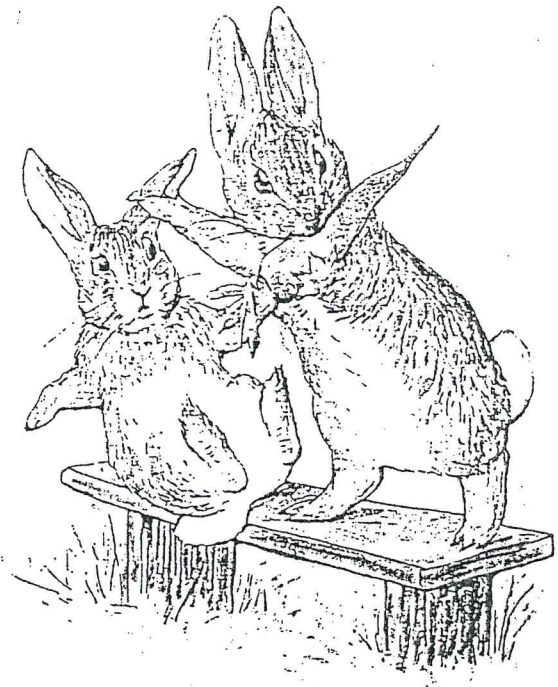
This is a nice gentle

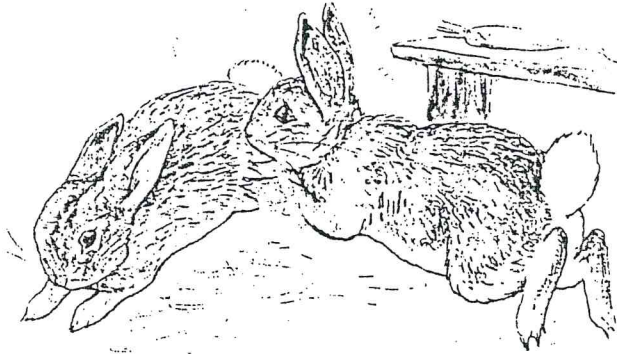


The bad Rabbit would like some carrot.

He takes it!

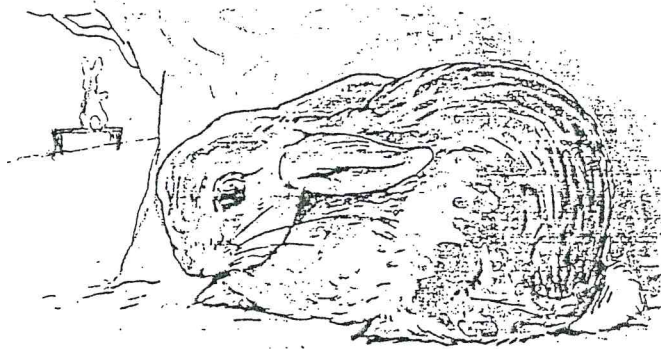

And he scratches the good Rabbit very badly.

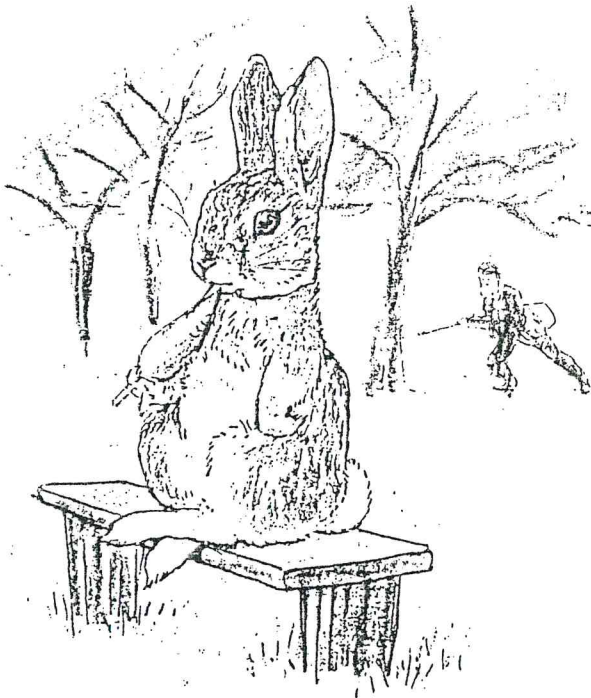
The good Rabbit creeps away, and hides in a hole. It feels sad.

a very funny bird!



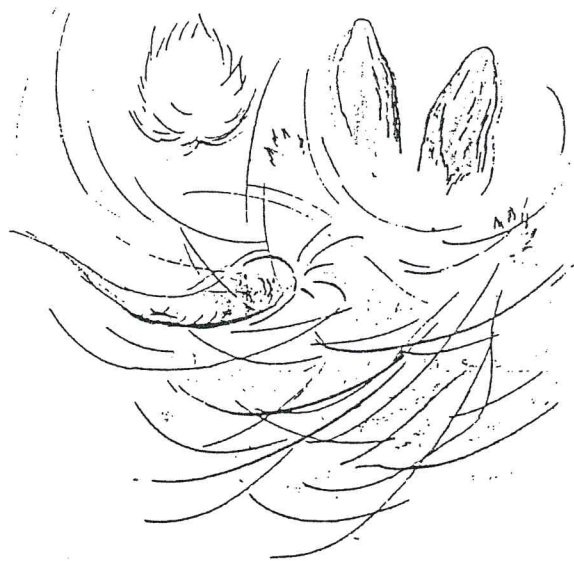
He comes creeping up

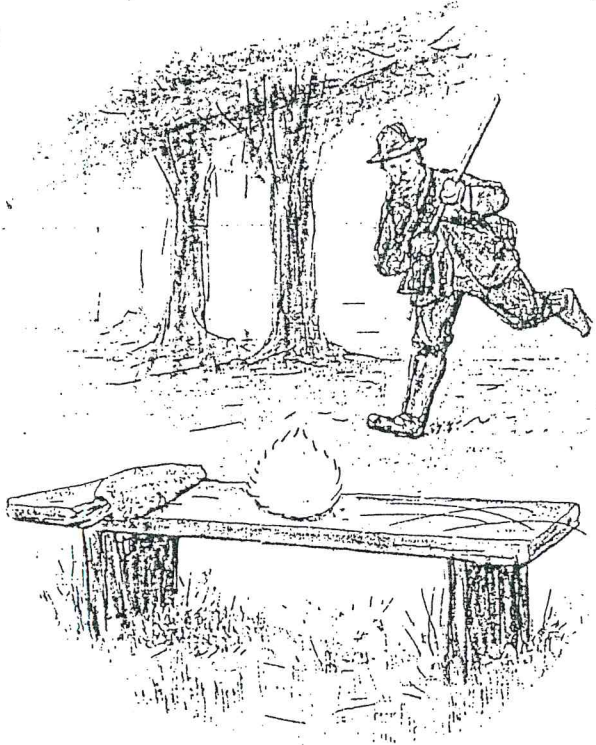


And then he shoots—

This is what happens—

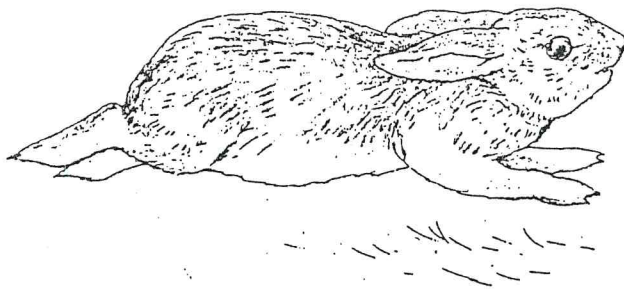
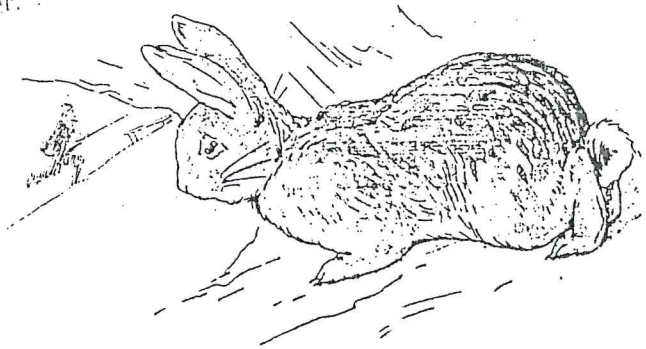

The good Rabbit peeps out of its hole.



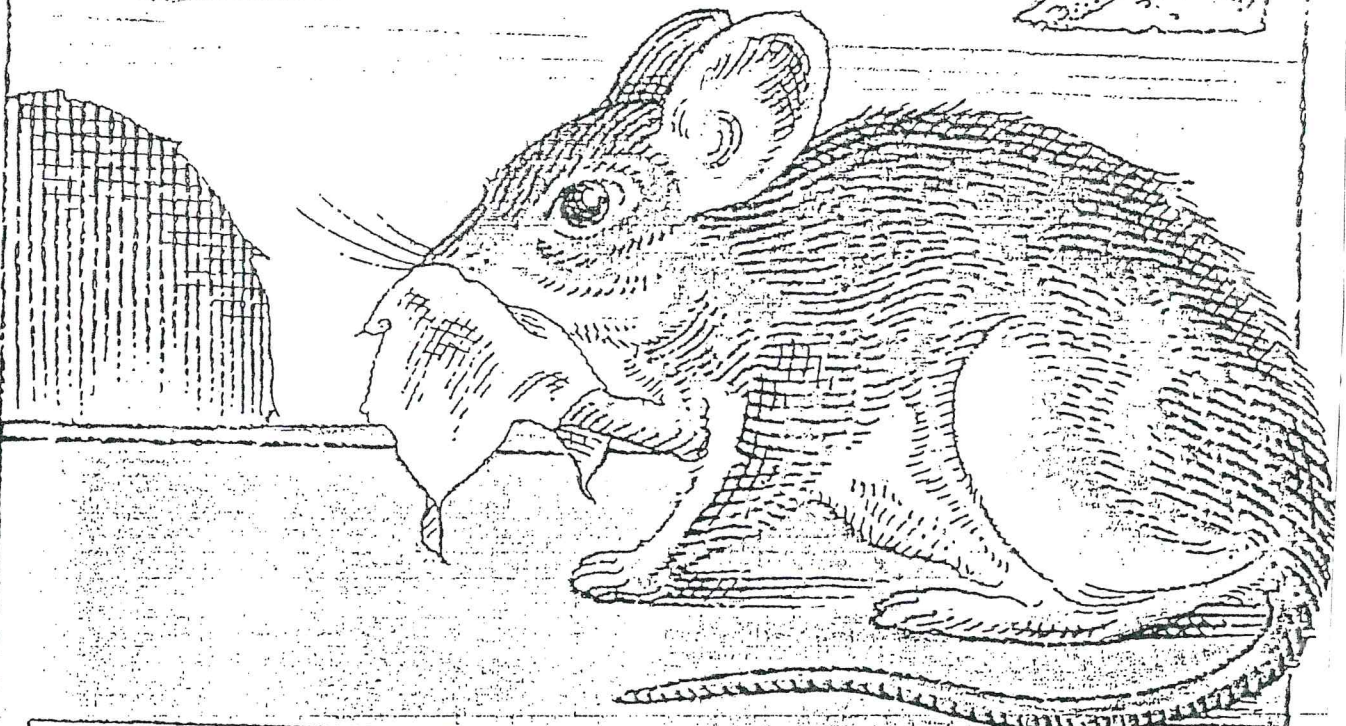
And it sees the bad Rabbit tearing past—without any tail or whiskers!

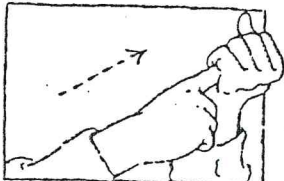


# Mousie

I've caught a cold!'

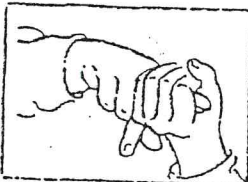


Close fist and push index finger of other hand through.

Waggle finger.



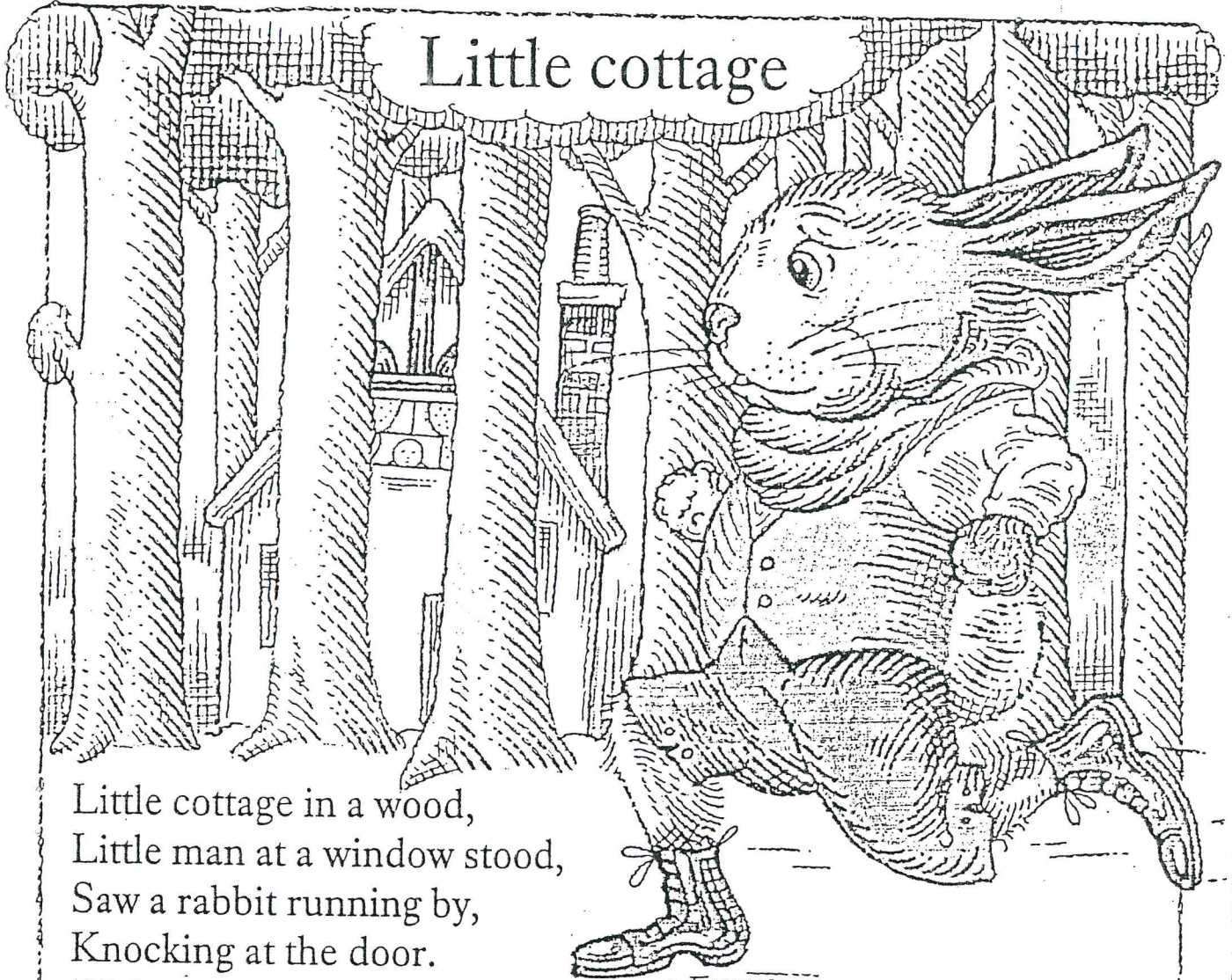
Mousie said, 'I'd like to stay.'
